An Artful Past

Whether it be colorful paintings or sculptures, the Dutch-speaking world has birthed many artists creating some of the most distinguished works of art. Housing the second-largest collection of Vincent Van Gogh paintings after the Van Gogh Museum, the Kröller-Müller Museum in the Netherlands holds an impressive assortment of stunning art. The museum was founded by avid art collector Helene Kröller-Müller, who is credited as being among the first to recognize Van Gogh's artistic genius. Stroll through the museum's picturesque sculpture garden bringing together art, nature, and architecture. Visit Michelangelo's iconic "Virgin and Child" marble sculpture within the medieval Church of Our Lady in Bruges, Belgium. At the Gothic St. Bavo's Cathedral, see Hubert and Jan van Eyck's "Adoration of the Mystic Lamb" altarpiece—considered the world's first major oil painting and the most frequently stolen artwork of all time. Finish your creative journey at the Royal Porcelain Factory and see how the famed blue and white Delftware is specially handmade—and even try your hand at creating the pottery yourself in Delft, the city "View of Delft" painter Johannes Vermeer called home.





KEUKENHOF GARDENS

Known around the world as the “Garden of Europe,” Keukenhof is a breathtaking tapestry of color and fragrance when its more than 1,000 floral varieties reach full bloom between mid-April and early May. Meticulously landscaped with tranquil ponds, placid streams, and winding, tree-shaded paths, this vibrantly hued oasis originally formed part of the Teylingen Castle estate, where the early 15th-century Countess Jacoba of Bavaria tended an herb and vegetable garden. The gardens of Keukenhof (translating to “kitchen garden”) was re-designed in 1857 by Jan David Zocher of Vondelpark fame and his son Louis Paul Zocher, paving the way for the gardens as we know it today. Leading flower bulb growers and exporters then created the plan in 1949 to use the estate to exhibit spring-flowering tulips and the park was an instant success when it opened to the public in 1950, drawing in 236,000 visitors during the first year alone. The nearly 500-acre Keukenhof has since developed into a world-famous display of bulbs adored by many anthophile visitors every year.

Depart Home City

Day 1

Depart your home city and board an overnight flight.

Amsterdam, the Netherlands/ Embark

Day 2

When you arrive embark the deluxe river boat AMADEUS CARA once you arrive in Amsterdam—built during the Golden Age of the Middle Ages. Later, attend the Captain's Welcome Reception with your fellow passengers and enjoy dinner onboard. (L,R,D)

Nijmegen for Kröller-Müller Museum

Day 3

Visit the world-class Kröller-Müller Museum, most lauded for its collection of

90 Vincent van Gogh paintings and 180 of his drawings.

See works by Pablo Picasso, Claude Monet, Pierre-Auguste Renoir, and Édouard Manet. Enjoy a walking tour of Nijmegen, a university town layered with more than 2,000 years of history and originally settled by the Romans in the first century B.C. Explore an array of pristinely preserved structures, including the turreted 15th-century De Waag—formerly one of the city's gates and currently Amsterdam's oldest secular building. (B,L,D)

Kinderdijk/ Delta Works

Day 4

In Kinderdijk, see the UNESCO-inscribed network of 19 authentic windmills

built between 1722 and 1761.

Visit one of the mills among the largest assembly of such in the Netherlands. You will have the option to either discover the Delta Works, an impressive feat of hydraulic engineering hailed as one of the Seven Wonders of the Modern World, or explore Veere, Netherlands, once known for its rich history as the center of the Scottish wool trade. (B,L,D)

Bruges, Belgium/Ghent

Day 5

A scenic drive through Flemish countryside takes you to Bruges, where you'll enjoy a walking tour to the Gothic Town Hall, the famous and UNESCO-inscribed octagonal belfry and tower, and the Church of Our Lady, with a visit to see Michelangelo's "Virgin and Child" marble

sculpture housed at the church. Stroll through Ghent, replete with medieval and classical architecture. Admire the windows and Gothic steeples of St. Bavo's Cathedral and see Hubert and Jan van Eyck's magnificent altarpiece "Adoration of the Mystic Lamb"—the most frequently stolen artwork of all time. See the Belfry of Ghent, the tallest belfry in Belgium and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. (B,L,D)

Antwerp **Day 6**

Discover the Old Town of Antwerp, which preserves its distinct Flemish culture while still maintaining its distinction as the commercial center of Belgium and an established diamond trading center. Visit

the UNESCO-inscribed belfry at Cathedral of Our Lady and see 17th-century Baroque masterpieces by the city's native son, Peter Paul Rubens. (B,L,D)

Rotterdam **for Delft and** **Keukenhof Gardens** **Day 7**

Saunter through historical Delft, where Johannes Vermeer painted his famous "View of Delft" from 1660 to 1661. Visit the original Delft factory of Royal Porceleyne Fles and watch craftspeople create the iconic "Delft Blue" porcelain. Enjoy lunch at the world-famous Keukenhof Gardens and stroll through its tableau of blooming tulips meticulously landscaped with tranquil ponds, placid streams, and tree-shaded

paths. Attend the Captain's Farewell Reception and Dinner on board the ship this evening. (B,L,R,D)

Horn/Amsterdam **Day 8**

Discover Hoorn, which rapidly grew to become a major harbor town during Holland's "Golden Age" and was an important home base for the Dutch East India Company. Enjoy a private cruise through the charming and picturesque canals of Amsterdam, listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. (B,L,D)

Amsterdam/Return to **Home City** **Day 9**

After breakfast, continue on to the post-program, or transfer to the airport for your return flight home. (B)
